Internship Experience

School of Ministry & Seminary Internship

- Internship is an integral part of preparation for ministry. It provides the intern with an extended, in-depth practice of ministry for the purpose of integrating classroom study with field experience. In addition, Internship provides our interns with a working relationship with another person in ministry rather than just a place to carry out practical Christian service. The intern is exposed to all forms and facets of the ministry but the primary focus in this experience is on the intern as a disciple in development and on the pastor-mentor as a teacher-leader.
- The oversight of the Internship Program is done by the Coordinator of Field Education and the Field Education Team.

General Information

Internship Expenses

- Seminary Internship Course (3 credits): approx. \$1300.
- School of Ministry Internship Course (6 credits): approx. \$2700.
- Internship administration fee of \$350 is added to student account at end of the Winter semester.

Length of Internships

- School of Ministry (undergrad): Minimum of 5 months—fulltime (40 hrs/wk). *
 - Seminary: Minimum of 3 months—fulltime (40 hrs/wk). *
- (* part-time equivalencies will be considered)

Recommended Finances for Undergraduate and Seminary Internships

- Single student: \$1000 per month + room and board.
- Married student: \$1400 per month + room and board.

Internship Seminar

- Attendance is mandatory for interns and mentors.
- Dates: Typically held at the end of April/Beginning of May.
- Internship Seminar: includes teaching sessions with guest presenters, relationship building time, communion, commissioning service, meals & more. This is an opportunity for you and your mentor to learn the expectations of internship and connect on your 'home turf.'

School of Ministry Prerequisites & Requirements

In addition to the specific course prerequisites listed below, students must:

1. Have completed at least 75-degree credits.
2. Maintain a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.0.
3. Successfully complete a Placement Interview.
4. Successfully submit all internship required documents.
5. Receive approval of the Field Education Department for the ministry internship placement.
6. Receive faculty approval and satisfactory feedback from Student Life.
7. Attend Internship Seminar – typically early May.

Seminary Prerequisites & Requirements

Students must complete Internship or Ministry Coaching with the approval of the Field Education Department if you are in the MDiv, MIM, or MLM degree programs.

Ministry Coaching is an alternative to Internship for those who have at least two years of ministry experience. Apply for Ministry Coaching if you have recently been in, or currently serve in full-time or significant part-time ministry, or if you completed an internship in an Ambrose undergraduate ministry program. Rev. Dr. Ric Strangway, Coordinator of Field Education, will assess whether your ministry experience qualifies for ministry coaching.

In addition to the specific course prerequisites listed below, students must:

1. Cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.7.
2. Successfully complete Placement Interview.
3. Receive approval of the Field Education Department for the ministry internship placement.
4. Receive faculty approval and satisfactory feedback from Student Life.
5. Successfully submit all internship required documents.
6. Attend Internship Seminar – typically early May.
